There are numerous places to eat and drink in Canterbury, a lot of chains and independent restaurants and cafes. These are some which are independents and are off the beaten track.

Daytime:

- Don Juan Cafe, Argentinian snacks in Dane John Gardens
- Saffron Café (next to 8 Castle Street)
- The Micro Roastery, St Margaret Street
- The Sandwich Bar, St Margaret Street
- Tiny Tims Tearoom, St Margaret Street
- Lazix, Butchery Lane (open air terrace on 1st floor)

Evening dining:

- Pinnochios, on Castle Street close to our hotel. Italian
- No. 35, 35 Margarets Street
- White Hart Inn, Castle Row. Closest pub to us with a garden and lovely food
- Pizza Express, get a table by the river or in their outside courtyard
- Weavers, High Street. Excellent steak. By the river and with an outside courtyard. Option to punt on the river and dine in the restaurant. (10% discount when you produce your Canterbury Punting receipt)
- The Olive Grove, Mediterranean restaurant (10% discount when you produce your Canterbury Punting receipt)
- Posillipo. Italian. Courtyard garden
- Café des Amis, Westgate. Mexican
- A La Turka, Westgate. Turkish
- Chapmans, Westgate. Fish
- The Dolphin Pub with beer garden
- The George at Fordwich, on the river on the outskirts of town
- Fordwich Arms at Fordwich, on the river on the outskirts of town
- Grove Ferry at Fordwich. All 3 Fordwich pubs are on the canoe route from Canterbury out to Fordwich
